

DISTICHIASIS & ECTOPIC CILIA

WHAT ARE DISTICHIA?

Distichia are extra, abnormally positioned eyelashes (cilia) along the eyelid margin. A few distichia hairs may not cause any issues, but presence of multiple or very spiky hairs can cause irritation, leading to redness, squinting and increased tear production. These will need to be removed to improve comfort.

WHAT ARE ECTOPIC CILIA?

Ectopic cilia are hairs that grow out of the conjunctiva inside the eyelid, and point directly towards the cornea. These always cause irritation and are associated with corneal ulcers so must be removed. They can be very small, and difficult to spot without magnification. These must be removed surgically to remove the follicle.

TREATMENT OPTIONS

- Manual removal:** plucking the hairs is the least invasive and costly method, but they will grow back in a few weeks.
- Cryopilation:** Involves freezing the distichia follicles inside the eyelid margin. This technique is beneficial to remove several distichia. Side effects include: temporary swelling of the eyelid, temporary loss of pigment on the eyelid margin. More than one procedure may be required to remove all distichia, but symptoms are often improved after the first treatment.
- Electrolysis:** The distichia follicles are burnt with an ophthalmic electrolysis unit. More than one procedure may be required to remove all the hairs.
- Conjunctival Strip Surgery:** Removal of a strip of palpebral conjunctiva containing the hair follicles. This is reserved for severe cases, or when non-invasive techniques have failed. Post-operative complications are rare, but include: minor eyelid scarring, and a reduced tear film quality.
